
Accommodations:

He began attending the Iowa School for the Blind at Vinton, Iowa. After five years, Rich was asked to leave the school for the blind because he was a discipline problem. He went back to Grinnell, IA, to attend public school. This was long before the integration of handicapped students into classrooms. Rich overcame many obstacles in his high school career. After high school graduation, Rich became the first person in his family to attend college. Rich graduated from Wartburg College in Waverly, IA., with majors in Business Administration and Business Education. He graduated in just 3 years while holding down numerous parttime jobs. He later received his MBA from the University of South Dakota. In January 2017, after 41 years in the investment business, Rich retired as Senior Vice President investment advisor of R. W. Baird. His team managed over 235 million in assets with clients from over 25 states doing business with fourth and fifth generations of family members. Rich is looking forward to the next chapter of his wonderful life and

giving and sharing with others.

Robbin Clark is an Expanded Core enthusiast!
